Prepare for August 7: This week we will begin a four week focus on lessons from the book of Hebrews. This week, Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16; we have an interesting look at what faith in God can do in our lives. To have faith in God, to trust in his goodness and love, means we will be aware of how what we know to be true does not line up with the world as it is right now. The author says the people of God, from the very beginning of the covenant with Abraham, longed for a better homeland or a better country. Do we long for anything today? A time or a place? For Abraham and Sarah, their longing was for something in the future. What longing do you feel for the future? How does our faith in God impact this desire and our response?
