

## Bible Reading for September 27

**Exodus 17:1-7** From the wilderness of Sin the whole congregation of the Israelites journeyed by stages, as the Lord commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. <sup>2</sup>The people quarreled with Moses, and said, "Give us water to drink." Moses said to them, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the Lord?" <sup>3</sup>But the people thirsted there for water; and the people complained against Moses and said, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst?" <sup>4</sup>So Moses cried out to the Lord, "What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me." <sup>5</sup>The Lord said to Moses, "Go on ahead of the people, and take some of the elders of Israel with you; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. <sup>6</sup>I will be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it, so that the people may drink." Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. <sup>7</sup>He called the place Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites quarreled and tested the Lord, saying, "Is the Lord among us or not?"

### Discussion Questions

• *Once more, the people are complaining to Moses. What is it they are lacking? Thinking more deeply, what else is it that they are lacking—not just the immediate physical need? Though God has already provided plenty of food for them, and has brought them safely into the wilderness, there's a concern that they will go thirsty. Yet we know God will take care of them! This is not a tension that will go away, throughout their forty years in the wilderness, the people will struggle to live in faith that God will take care of them. How have you learned to trust Jesus, to rely on God, in your life? Are there places where it is difficult to see how God could provide?*
